Issues

1. Poverty	Opposed permanent improvements to refundable tax credits for low-income working families (EITC and CTC) ¹	Supported modifying the earned income tax credit (EITC) to include non-custodial parents ²
2. Wages/jobs	Sponsored the Second Chance Re-Authorization Act, which helps returning citizens who have completed their prison/jail sentences successfully return to society ³	Supported raising the federal minimum wage ⁴
3. Global Hunger	Supported the Global Food Security Act, which supports a U.S. strategy to combat hunger and malnutrition in developing countries	<i>Currently has no public stance on global hunger</i>

Where does Bread stand?

Bread for the World supports effective policies that promote help and opportunity for people who struggle with hunger and poverty. In 2017, Congress must do its part to put our nation and the world on track to end hunger by 2030. This means:

1. Improving and expanding refundable tax credits for low-income working families (earned income and child tax credits)
2. Raising the minimum wage and expanding job benefits, such as paid sick and family leave
3. Expanding and improving global development assistance focused on hunger, poverty, and nutrition
